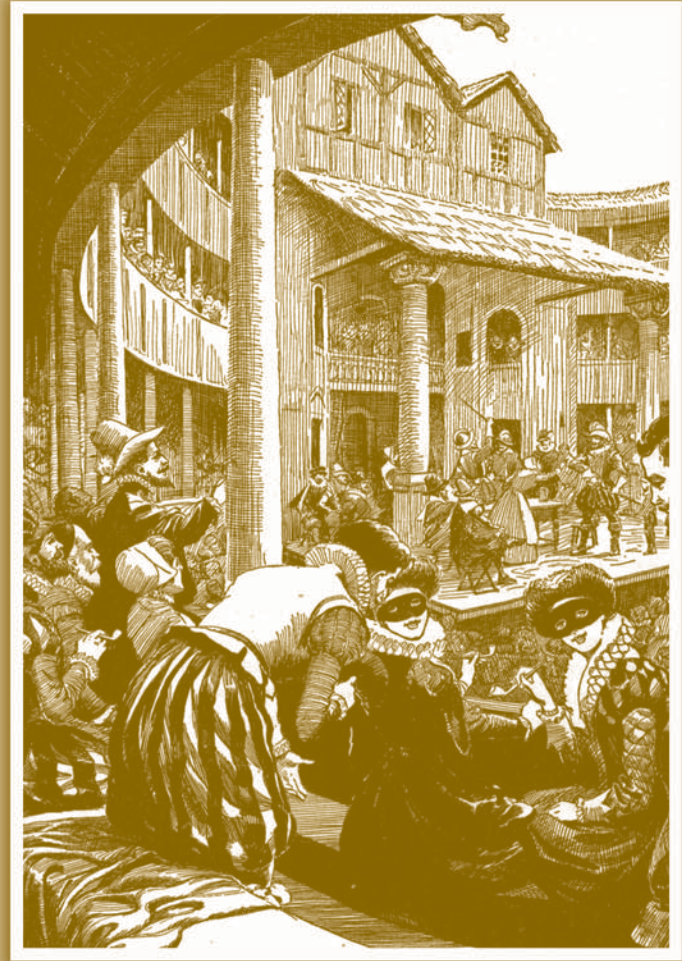

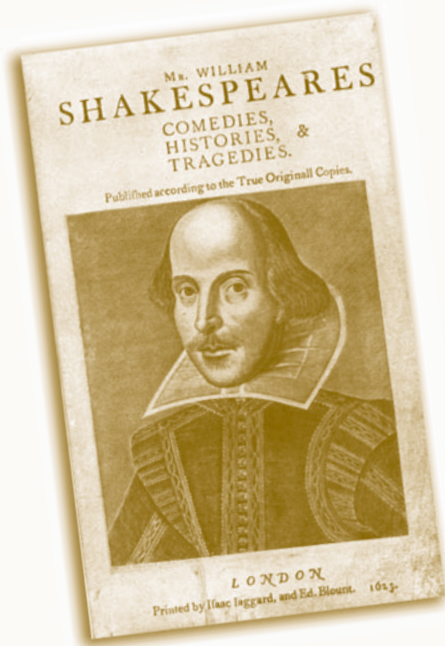

## *Shakespeare in Performance: London and Stratford-upon-Avon*

*June 24 – July 7, 2007*

Offered by Georgetown University's Department of English  
and the Office of International Programs

*Spend 2 weeks with the Bard in London and Stratford-upon-Avon!  
See performances at Shakespeare's Globe and the Royal  
Shakespeare Theatre, attend lectures by Shakespearian scholars  
and earn college credits along the way!*

### *Stratford-upon-Avon:*

The second week of the course will take place in Stratford-upon-Avon, the town where Shakespeare was born. This week will focus on the productions of the Royal Shakespeare Company, the most renowned Shakespearian company in the world. Students will attend several plays in Stratford. In 2006, participants saw six plays: *Henry 4, Parts 1 and 2*, *Romeo and Juliet*, *Henry 6, Part 1*, and *Julius Caesar*. The plays for 2007 will be announced on the Office of International Programs website as soon as we get word from London and Stratford.

In Stratford, classes will be taught by Shakespearian scholars and members of the Royal Shakespeare Company involved in the productions. Students will also get a taste of some more practical performance skill, either through a class on voice control or a master acting class. And finally, Georgetown faculty will take students on a short tour of Shakespearian Stratford, which will include a visit to the house in which Shakespeare was born; a trip to Trinity Church, the place where Shakespeare is buried; and a country walk to nearby Anne Hathaway's Cottage, the Elizabethan farmhouse where Shakespeare wooed his wife-to-be.

### *London:*

Students begin in London, where they spend a week focusing on Shakespeare's Globe, the replica of the open air stage where many of Shakespeare's plays were first performed. Participants will tour the Globe and attend three Shakespearian performances, at least one of which will be staged at the Globe. In the summer of 2006, students attended performances of *Antony and Cleopatra* at the Globe, *Midsummer Night's Dream* at Regent's Park Open Air Theatre, and *Macbeth* at Creation Theatre in Oxford. But this list of plays, of course, changes each year.

Students will also attend lectures and participate in discussions centering on these performances. Perhaps best of all, students will have the opportunity to discuss the work of the Globe with a member of the company. Friday afternoon and Saturday of this first week will be left free for students to explore London further.

### *Course Credit:*

Students who successfully complete the Georgetown program will receive three English credits. The course will be listed as ENGL 363-62.

### **Applications:**

To apply, first download an application from the Office of International Programs website. A minimum GPA of 2.7 is required. **Applications are due by March 16, 2007.** A \$35 nonrefundable application fee must accompany the application. All students are also required to submit two assessment forms from two different professors. These forms are also available for download on the Office of International Programs website. Georgetown welcomes participation in this course form non-Georgetown students.

### **Tuition and Fees:**

The cost of the program for summer 2007 will be \$4700. Program costs include tuition, accommodations (with breakfast), in London and Stratford, round-trip rail transportation between London and Stratford, two dinners in London and one in Stratford, and tickets to all performances. Students are responsible for all other meals, personal expenses, and round-trip travel between the United States and London.

Applicants who are accepted into the program must confirm their places with a \$500 non-refundable deposit by **April 2, 2007**. The deadline for full payment of program fees is **May 4, 2007**.

### **Refunds:**

Your acceptance form and program deposit are considered a good-faith commitment to participate in this Georgetown University program. Withdrawal from a summer program must be made in writing to the summer program coordinator. Please note that application fees and program deposits are nonrefundable.

Georgetown University will refund recoverable tuition and costs as determined by our partner institutions. Refunds will be calculated from the date the Office of International Programs is notified in writing of your intent to withdraw.
